CLIPPER STRONG FUND MINI-GRANTS -- The Clipper Strong Fund Committee's **new effort is a mini-grant program that will award grants of up to \$500 to businesses in need of short-term relief to cover such expenses as utility bills, rent, PPE or other expenses.** To qualify to apply for a Clipper Strong Fund mini-grant, the applicant must be:

1. An independent business with 10 or fewer employees (whether full- or part-time).
2. A Portsmouth business in existence for at least 6 months prior to March 13, 2020 (the date of Governor Sununu's COVID-19 Emergency Order).
3. Able to define the intended use of the grant of up to a maximum of \$500. Eligible uses include: COVID-19 safety modifications for employees or the public, inventory or new equipment required to reopen under the COVID-19 guidelines, rent, utilities, employee benefits or marketing materials (including printed or online media for public information). Successful applicants will be expected to prove the need with invoices or written estimates.

HYDRANT AND WATER MAIN FLUSHING CONTINUES, 7-11 pm -- Monday through Thursday for the next six weeks. The flushing operation covers both public and private hydrants in Portsmouth, New Castle, Rye, Greenland and Newington. Crews open select fire hydrants, releasing water with enough velocity to carry sediment out of the pipes. Residents are advised that when the Water Division trucks with flashing lights are working in their neighborhood, they should refrain from washing laundry to avoid any potential discoloration of clothing. While flushing can result in discolorations to tap water, the water remains safe to drink. When flushing is finished, water customers should run cold water to clear any discolored water in their plumbing systems. If the discoloration persists, customers should contact the Water Division through the Click ‘n Fix system to ensure prompt response.

DOWNTOWN WORKFORCE PARKING PROGRAM AVAILABLE YEAR-ROUND -- Qualified employees of downtown Portsmouth businesses can park in the Foundry Place Garage for only \$3 per parking session, rather than the per-hour parking rate. By joining the Downtown Workforce Parking Program, they purchase stickers to affix to their parking receipts. Each employee is eligible to buy up to 20 parking stickers per month. To participate, the employee of a Downtown Portsmouth business must show a photo ID and current proof of paycheck issued by a downtown business and submit the application form in person at the Foundry Parking Garage office.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION DAY, SAT OCT 3, from 8 am to 12 noon at the DPW Recycling Center, 680 Peverly Hill Road –

Household hazardous waste collection helps safely dispose of items that can harm residents' health, the environment and drinking water supplies. Collection Day is organized as a no-touch, drive-through service. Residents remain in their vehicles and pull through the Public Works garage, where staff will remove disposable items from car trunks. All City staff will be wearing masks and will be practicing physical distancing. Staff will ask participants for their town of residence for survey purposes, in compliance with EPA requirements. Proof of residency in Portsmouth, Newington or Greenland is required. DPW PROJECTS THIS WEEK:

SOUTH STREET PAVING – Prep work continues for paving the section of South Street between Junkins Ave. and Marcy Street. No parking allowed in this section between 7 am and 5 pm. Residents with on-street parking should park in the lower lot at City Hall.

ISLINGTON STREET DETOUR BETWEEN BARLETT & CASS STREETS -- Traffic flow will be reduced to one lane of one-way westbound traffic between Cass Street and Bartlett Street. Eastbound traffic on Islington will be detoured onto Jewell Court and around the work zone via Brewery Lane and Cass Street. Flaggers and/or police details will be present to help direct traffic. Drivers should expect minor delays. Parking restrictions will be in place at all times along the detour until the winter shutdown between mid-December and next April and will resume until the project is completed in June 2021.
