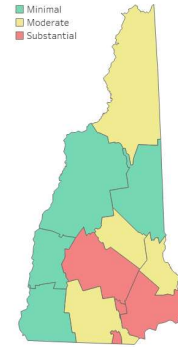
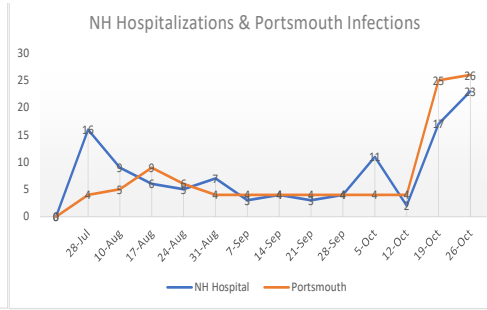
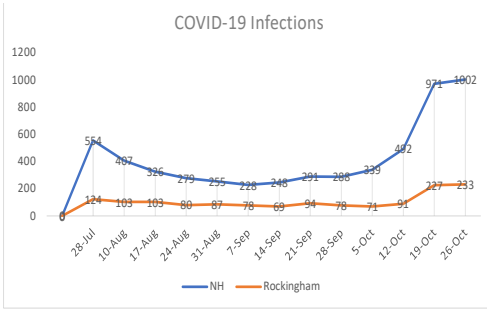

NH & Rockingham County Cases By Week

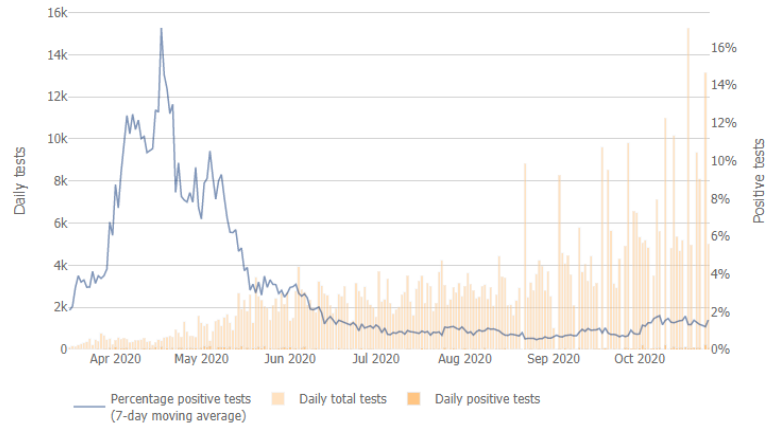
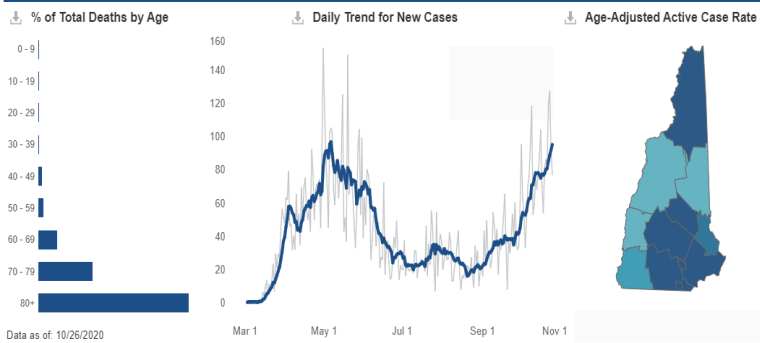
