PERFORMANCE VENUES Deadline is Tues. Oct 13. -- This program supports New Hampshire performance venues who are facing revenue losses due to COVID-19, provided that they are primarily engaged in hosting live theatrical presentations, musical entertainment, and/or sporting or racing events, that are seated, ticketed, and open to the public. Click here for the application, which **must be completed and submitted by Tuesday, October 13, 2020, at 11:59 PM, including all supporting documentation,** including copies of the business's year-end 2019 and current year-to-date financial statements showing monthly actual and projected facility-specific gross receipts, as applicable, from March 1, 2019 to December 30, 2020 and the organization must agree to continue operations for two more

NON-DAIRY FARM RELIEF FOR COVID-19 LOSSES, JULY THROUGH SEPTEMBER. Deadline

Thurs. Oct 15 -- This program generally supports non-dairy farms that have experienced negative financial impacts due to COVID-19. To apply for relief funding using this application, you must be:

- 1. A fruit, vegetable, or ornamental plant grower, or maple producer that: (a) successfully registered for the original program by June 22, 2020; AND (b) had COVID-19-related expenses and/or lost sales during the period from July 1, 2020 to September 30, 2020; **or**
- 2. Any other non-dairy farm that: (a) could not register for the original program, or missed the registration deadline; AND (b) had, during the period from July 1, 2020 to September 30, 2020, average COVID-19-related expenses of at least \$500 per month, and/or average COVID-19-related lost sales of at least \$1,000 per month.

Please note: To complete/submit your application, you will need to upload copies of QuickBooks or other accounting system reports, or tax forms, etc., to verify your COVID-19-related expenses and/or lost sales comparing the applicable time period to the same time last year.

As the author notes, "Faced with a pandemic, states, counties and cities made the shift to remote work — in a hurry." Focusing on Montgomery County PA, State of Massachusetts and Portsmouth she cites the City of Portsmouth IT Department's December and January upgrades that allowed the City to shift to remote working while retaining the necessary security for the network. And increasing available bandwidth by ten times. IT Director Alan Brady was quoted as saying, "With the infrastructure changes that were made, end users were able to remotely log in to their computers without any major issues. We were able to get everybody back online."

MAPLEWOOD AVE. DOWNTOWN INTERSECTION CROSSING SIGNALS -- New Maplewood Ave downtown intersection pedestrian crossing signals working: make sure you press the button for the crosswalk you want. There are now two buttons. Pedestrians and motorists downtown at the intersections of

Maplewood Avenue and Deer Street, Hanover Street and Congress Street now experience new pedestrian-crossing patterns thanks to an upgrade in the traffic signals. Previously, all vehicle traffic stopped at the same time for pedestrian crossing in all directions. That cycle caused delays. The new timing gives pedestrians the WALK signal while the traffic moving parallel with them has the green signal. Turning traffic will be required to yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk. New signs posted at each intersection and electronic message boards will alert drivers to the need to yield to pedestrians when turning at intersections.

CITY AND NH THEATRE PROJECT PRESENT COMMUNITY DISCUSSION ON SUICIDE AND SELF-HARM OCT 14 -- City of Portsmouth and NH Theatre Project present a reading of the play *Final Thoughts* by Tim Barretto, and a community discussion on the topic of Suicide & Self-Harm on Wednesday, October 14 at 6:30 pm via Zoom. Co-sponsored by Seacoast Mental Health Center, this program is part of New Hampshire Theatre Project's Elephant-in-the-Room Series® (EITR). *Final Thoughts* will be performed by Bill Humphreys, Peter Josephson, and Teddi Kenick-Bailey, along with Portsmouth actors Genevieve Aichele, Blair Hundertmark and CJ Lewis. Immediately following the reading, NHTP's Artistic Director Catherine Stewart will facilitate a community discussion designed for teenagers and adults with panelists Dennis Walker, Director of Emergency Services at Seacoast Mental Health Center; playwright Tim Barretto; and Lt. David Keaveny from the Portsmouth Police Department. The Portsmouth High School guidance department is also providing assistance during the program for those who might want to discuss issues the play or conversation might trigger. WATER RESTRICTIONS STILL IN EFFECT – The DPW Water Division is restricting Water customers to use for watering lawns and gardens only on odd-numbered days, between midnight and 10 am. The Portsmouth Fire Department announces that no new permits will be issued until further notice. Also, the Fire Chief urges residents with Class 1 and 2 backyard fire permits to use extreme caution when kindling fires, to not burn if it is windy and to be extra sure the fire is extinguished before leaving it for the evening.

HYDRANT AND WATER MAIN FLUSHING CONTINUES, 7-11 pm -- Monday through Thursday for the next several weeks. The flushing operation covers both public and private hydrants in Portsmouth, New Castle, Rye, Greenland and Newington. Crews open select fire hydrants, releasing water with enough velocity to carry sediment out of the pipes. Residents are advised that when the Water Division trucks with flashing lights are working in their neighborhood, they should refrain from washing laundry to avoid any potential discoloration of clothing. While flushing can result in discolorations to tap water, the water remains safe to drink. When flushing is finished, water customers should run cold water to clear any discolored water in their plumbing systems. All of the above said that flu shots are covered at no cost with most insurances and Medicare.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the Center cannot accommodate voting within the City Hall Municipal Complex. **The City Clerk's Office staff will also be available outside of City Hall on Saturday October 10, October 17, October 24 and October 31, from 9 am to 12 noon, to collect absentee ballots (only from voters who are returning their own ballots).** Please contact the City Clerk's office at 610-7245 with any questions

DPW PROJECTS THIS WEEK:

SUPPORT THE BUSINESSES ON ISLINGTON STREET. YOU CAN GET THERE FROM HERE! The construction/detour between Cass and Bartlett (and on either side) has brought challenges to businesses on that section. All of the businesses – White Heron Café, Papa Wheelies, The Kitchen, Seacoast Auto Parts, Flote, Dogland, Luigi's, STREET, Blaze Yoga & Pilates, Sweet Pea Bakery, Nest, Herbal Nails, Decades, Portsmouth Escape Room, Liar's Bench, Kaffe Kilim, Ohana, Botanica, Oomph, Cornerstone and more! – are open and looking forward to welcoming you.

ISLINGTON STREET DETOUR BETWEEN BARLETT & CASS STREETS -- Traffic flow will be reduced to one lane of one-way westbound traffic between Cass Street and Bartlett Street. Eastbound traffic on Islington will be detoured onto Jewell Court and around the work zone via Brewery Lane and Cass Street. Flaggers and/or police details will be present to help direct traffic. Drivers should expect minor delays. Parking restrictions will be in place at all times along the detour until the winter shutdown between mid-December and next April and will resume until the project is completed in June 2021. SOUTH STREET PAVING – Paving complete, just need to stripe the section of South Street between Junkins Ave. and Marcy Street this week. No parking allowed in this section between 7 am and 5 pm. Residents with onstreet parking should park in the lower lot at City Hall.

KEARSARGE & MARKET STREET BRIDGES – Traffic reduced to one lane, police detail and flaggers in place. Work to upgrade the traffic signals at the downtown intersections with Maplewood also continues.
