CITY ANNOUNCES PROPERTY TAX RATE -- The New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration has approved the City's 2020 tax rate for Fiscal Year 2021 of **\$14.70 per \$1,000 of valuation**. The 2020 tax rate has **dropped by 16 cents or 1.1% from the prior year's tax rate** of \$14.86. Finance Director Judie Belanger noted the median single-family property value in Portsmouth as of April 1, 2020 increased from \$470,850 to \$474,900, or \$4,050 (less than 1%). The median single-family homeowner will pay \$6,981 in TY2020 compared to \$6,997 in 2019. **The newly approved tax rate will be reflected in the tax bills mailed this month, with the first half due 30 days after they are mailed** and the second half due in June 2021. With COVID-19 precautions still in place, the City urges taxpayers to make their tax bill payments online, where they will receive an instant confirmation and receipt.

CITY CLERK ANNOUNCES 69% VOTER TURNOUT IN GENERAL ELECTION -- Kelli Barnaby, City Clerk for the City of Portsmouth announced that 14,771 citizens (of 21,563 registered voters) voted in the Presidential race in the General Election on November 3, both in-person at the five Portsmouth Wards and via absentee ballots. This represents a 69% voter turnout. The City registered 1,188 new voters in this election. Compared to the last Presidential Election in 2016, the City recorded an increase in ballots and in total registered voters, but a slight decrease in turnout, which in 2016 was 71%.

- **Housing Relief Fund-** Governor Chris Sununu authorized the expenditure of \$35 million from the CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Fund (“flex funds”) to support families or individuals in need of housing assistance as a result of COVID-19. Of the allocated \$35 million, \$20 million will be initially expended, with \$15 million being held in reserve, for rent stabilization and housing support. Both the one-time grants and the short-term rental assistance will be coupled with regional case management services to help connect households to appropriate services as defined by the household and the agency. **Program payments will be made directly to the landlord or provider, and this program will end by December 30, 2020.** For more information, visit <https://www.capnh.org>
- **Help Paying Energy Bills** – Eversource offers a COVID-19 Payment Program that gives customers up to 12 months to pay past-due balances, without down payments, fees or interest. - **Federal Stimulus Checks** – Anyone who has not received a stimulus check from the Federal government can still file to do so. The deadline is **November 21, 2020 at 3 pm.** If you did not file a 2019 Federal Income Tax return, did not receive a stimulus check and have not already applied, visit this IRS website to file your application: **Social Security, Railroad Retirement and Veterans Affairs Benefits recipients who received their Stimulus Checks but still need to file to receive benefits for qualifying children also have until November 21, 2020 at 3 pm to apply. VETERANS DAY OBSERVED WED NOV 11 – City offices and municipal buildings will be closed all day on Wednesday, November 11 in honor of Veterans Day. The Post Commander of Portsmouth Frank E. Booma Post 6 of the American Legion reports that instead of the usual Veterans Day ceremonies this year, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Veterans Day will be commemorated with a wreath-laying at the Soldiers & Sailors Monument in Goodwin Park. Post Commander Frank Desper, who is also president of the Central Veterans Council, explained that while the Governor's “Safer At Home” protocols are still in place, the commemoration will not include the usual gathering of numbers of people, speakers or the Portsmouth High School Clipper Band.

SIGN UP FOR WINTER PARKING BAN ALERTS -- Portsmouth's snow plowing operations typically begin when snow levels exceed two inches, at which time a citywide parking ban may go into effect in order to facilitate snow removal. Residents can take advantage of spaces in City parking lots and garages when the parking bans are in effect. Residents are encouraged to take advantage of flat fee parking: \$3 at Foundry Place and \$5 at the Hanover garage, good from the time an anticipated ban is announced, until 2 hours after. Regular rates apply for additional time parked. Parking bans for snow removal are announced in several different ways:

DPW PROJECTS

PEIRCE ISLAND ROAD SEWER FORCE MAIN WORK -- Scaffolding will be installed along the underside of the Peirce Island Road Bridge and the work will limit travel to a single lane of alternating one-way travel on weekdays between 7:30 am and 3:30 pm, continuing to Tuesday, Nov 10. Flaggers will be placed on either end of the bridge to control traffic.

DENNETT STREET – Roadwork continues all week. **Paving now scheduled for SATURDAY, Nov 7, from 7 am to mid-afternoon.** Crews will then need to raise all the manhole covers up to grade for the winter the following week.

FLEET STREET RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT PUBLIC INPUT MEETING NOV 10 -- As the DPW prepares to start field work, they will host a second Public Input Meeting on the Fleet Street Reconstruction Project, via Zoom, on November 10 at 6:30 pm. For Zoom registration instructions, click here: <https://www.cityofportsmouth.com/sites/default/files/2020-10/Fleet%20Street%20Zoom%20Agenda%202020.11.10.pdf> This meeting will discuss the specific testing and inspection activities necessary to locate and identify connections to the City's sewer, water and drain systems. The inspection work will require access to buildings in the project area.

ISLINGTON STREET DETOUR BETWEEN BARLETT & CASS STREETS -- Traffic flow will be reduced to one lane of one-way westbound traffic between Cass Street and Bartlett Street. Eastbound traffic on Islington will be detoured onto Jewell Court and around the work zone via Brewery Lane and Cass Street. Flaggers and/or police details will be present to help direct traffic. Drivers should expect minor delays. Parking restrictions will be in place at all times along the detour until the winter shutdown between mid-December and next April and will resume until the project is completed in June 2021.
