For Agenda and Zoom registration, click here. http://files.cityofportsmouth.com/agendas/2021/city council/CC AGENDA 3-11-21 spec.pdf The Great Bay Total Nitrogen General Permit (General Permit) governing the discharge of nitrogen from municipal wastewater into the Great Bay Estuary, was issued by the Environmental Protection Agency on November 24, 2020 and became effective February 1, 2021. The opt-in election date for Portsmouth and surrounding affected towns is April 1, 2021. This meeting is to discuss the staff recommendation that Portsmouth opt-in to the General Permit as it will provide both greater flexibility over the long term for meeting regulatory compliance and a more collaborative framework for protecting and promoting water quality throughout

collaborative effort and the NH Attorney General's office has also approved the form of this agreement.

FLEET STREET PROECT SOIL BORINGS – As preliminary engineering studies for the Fleet Street Project continue, the contractor Underwood Engineering will be conducting boring work on



COVID-19 VACCINE ADMINISTRATION IN NEW HAMPSHIRE – As of March 10, NH had

received 531,815 doses of vaccine and had vaccinated 405,366 (22% of the NH population has received 1 or more doses). The dose balance ensures vaccine for those scheduled to receive first or second doses in the current Phase 1A-1B. For the

Scheduling your Dose 1 appointment online at https://vaccines.nh.gov

is the fastest, most efficient way to do so and is highly encouraged. Those 65+ who do not have Internet access and need assistance can call Brinn Sullivan [603-610-4433] at the Portsmouth Senior Activity Center.

Everyone receiving the first dose now receives a vaccination card that includes a scheduled appointment for Dose 2. All you need to do is show up for Dose 2. If you need to change that appointment, you can do so by calling the 211 hotline.
