GREENLEAF SKATE PARK PAVING WED &



LOCAL HISTORY: COLD WAR PORTSMOUTH

TUES MAY 18 at 6:30 pm via Zoom. Join the premiere viewing of a 16-minute audio-visual tour of Portsmouth during the 1950s! The film and discussion will complement the 68-page photo-illustrated historical documentation of economic, social and cultural life in Portsmouth during the Cold War period created in collaboration with the Portsmouth Community Development Department and the NH Division of Historic Resources. The 1950s were a time of rapid growth in housing, transportation and recreation as the Seacoast Region was transformed by expansions at the Pease Air Force Base and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard during Cold War international tensions and the threat of nuclear war between the US and the Soviet Union. This video captures historical photos and recollections of what we did for work, where we lived, where we shopped and ate, what we did for recreation, urban renewal, and other social and cultural aspects of

renewal, and other social and cultural aspects of Portsmouth during the Cold War. It will be followed by a Q & A and other recollections of the 1950s by community member panelists, moderated by City Community Development and Portsmouth Public Library staff.
