

Additionally this week, the Peirce Island Wastewater Treatment Facility construction contractor will finish cleaning up the gravel parking area previously offlimits to visitors while the facility was being built. This will allow for parking and access to the trails, although some areas are still fenced off to protect newly landscaped ground. The outdoor pool parking lot will remain off limits until restoration is complete, but will be reopened before the pool opening. Access may be limited at times after that while work on the pool parking lot is completed.
