\$40 MILLION STATE HOMEOWNER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM --

The New Hampshire Homeowner Assistance Fund allows homeowners with incomes less than 125% of their area median income to apply for up to \$20,000 in aid for property-related expenses such as delinquent mortgage payments, homeowner insurance payments, property taxes, and homeowner association or co-op fees. The program also allows for up to \$3,000 in utility payments. The new program is available only to property owners who experienced a disruption to their income as a result of the pandemic. HIGHER ASSET LIMITS SET TO QUALIFY FOR ELDERLY AND DISABLED TAX REDUCTIONS --

The City Council has raised the Elderly Tax asset limit to \$500,000 (from \$175,000) and the Disabled Tax asset limit, also to \$500,000. The Council also approved extending the Disabled Veteran/Disabled Officer exemption to \$4,000 and added flexibility on the April 15 deadline so taxpayers have time to make arrangements with the City Clerk. SEASONAL ROAD IMPACTS STARTING IN APRIL -- For information about each DPW project starting up for the season next week, the drop down Projects menu on the DPW page on the City website. Projects include:

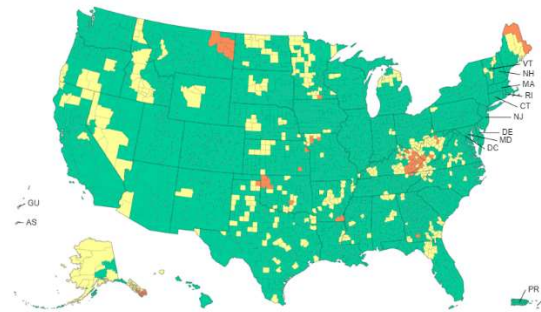
- **Outdoor dining barriers** placed downtown, starting Apr 4.
- Excavation for the [60 Penhallow Brick Market project](#) will close **Daniel Street between Penhallow and Market Square from April 4 to 22** and will limit traffic starting Apr 25 for sidewalk work. Businesses and pedestrian access will be open throughout construction.
- [Lang-Longmeadow Road](#) connector project is underway, with trees removed last week for the placement of erosion control measures.

HYDRANT FLUSHING STARTING APR 11

The flushing will take place at various locations, Monday through Thursday, between 7 am and 11 pm, for the next six weeks. The flushing program is critical for maintaining water quality throughout the distribution system by removing sediment buildup in both public and private hydrants in Portsmouth, New Castle, Rye, Greenland and Newington. Crews open select fire hydrants, releasing water with enough velocity to carry sediment out of the pipes. Flushing locations are indicated by the presence of DPW Water Division vehicles with flashing lights.



REMINDER DOG LICENSE DEADLINE IS APRIL 30 – New or annual renewals: **\$10 per** male or female dog. **\$7.50 per** neutered or spayed dog. **\$3 per dog owned by a Senior Citizen** (age 65 or older; first dog only). **\$7.50 per each puppy aged 3 to 7 months** for first-time licensing. Proof of spay/neuter will be required for the next April 1st licensing. Licenses available from the City Clerk’s Office in City Hall. 1 Junkins Ave. Portsmouth. CDC GUIDANCE ON ASSESSING COMMUNITY RISK – CDC recommends using its online tool -- [COVID-19 Community Levels](#) -- to help decide what prevention steps to take based on the latest data. Levels can be low, medium, or high and are determined by looking at hospital beds being used, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area. **The City Manager encourages the use of masks indoors in City facilities. Please note that masks are still required in the Portsmouth Public Library.**

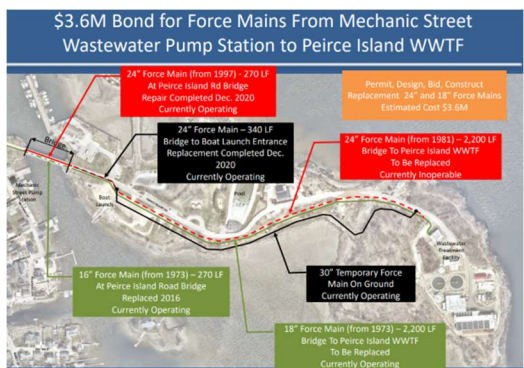

FEDERAL INCOME TAX FILING DEADLINE:

APR 18, 2022 -- The due date is April 18, instead of April 15, because of the Emancipation Day holiday in the District of Columbia for everyone except taxpayers who live in Maine or Massachusetts. Taxpayers in Maine or Massachusetts have until April 19, 2022, to file their returns due to the Patriots' Day holiday in those states. RUTH LEWIN GRIFFIN PLACE AFFORDABLE HOUSING APPLICATION SITE NOW OPEN!

The Portsmouth Housing Authority development, now under construction, features 48 one-bedroom apartments and 16 two-bedroom units. The units will be available to people who meet income requirements. EMERGENCY RENTAL & UTILITIES

ASSISTANCE – The [NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program](#) (NHERAP) provides funds to renters who cannot pay their rent and utilities during the pandemic. The program works with tenants and landlords. Program changes as of October 1, 2021:

- Households may qualify for assistance for past-due and future rent and utility payments for a period not to exceed 18 months.
- At least one person in the household must have qualified for unemployment benefits, had their income reduced, had significant costs, or had other financial hardship during the pandemic. Certain income requirements must be met.

WHAT THE PROGRAM COVERS

- Past-due rent including reasonable late and legal fees.
- Three months of future rent payments if needed for housing stability.
- Utilities, such as electricity, home heating costs, water, sewer, trash.
- Other housing-related costs such as internet and relocation expenses (including rental application fees, utility hook-up fees, and security deposits).
- Households may qualify for utility assistance even if they do not receive or need rental assistance.
