APRIL IS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS

MONTH -- Every 68 seconds someone in America is sexually assaulted, and that every nine minutes, that victim is a child; that 41% of the most recent sexual assaults reported in the New Hampshire occurred when the victim was 18 or younger and 83% before they were 25; and one out of every six American women and one in 33 American men have been the victim of an attempted or completed rape in their lifetimes. Here in Portsmouth, our social services agencies such as Haven and Operation Blessing, our hospitals and our Police Department, struggle daily trying to help the victims of sexual assault pick up the pieces. BRIDGE STREET LOT UPGRADES APR 11 – MID-MAY -- The lot will be fenced off and closed during construction. The Bridge Street Lot work includes reconstruction of the paved area, handicapped accessibility upgrades, subsurface preparations that would allow for EV charging stations and landscaping.

HYDRANT FLUSHING STARTS APR 11

The flushing will take place at various locations, Monday through Thursday, between 7 am and 11 pm, for the next six weeks. The flushing program is critical for maintaining water quality throughout the distribution system by removing sediment buildup in both public and private hydrants in Portsmouth, New Castle, Rye, Greenland and Newington. Crews open select fire hydrants, releasing water with enough velocity to carry sediment out of the pipes. Flushing locations are indicated by the presence of DPW Water Division vehicles with flashing lights.

MOSQUITO CONTROL MONITORING STARTS

MON APR 11 -- Crews from Dragon Mosquito Control, Inc., the City's contracted service, will be checking swamps, salt marshes, woodland pools, ditches, catch basins and other shallow, stagnant water for mosquito larvae. Citywide night-time road spraying for adult mosquitoes is not planned. Any decision to conduct emergency spraying of adult mosquitoes on City-owned property is made by City officials based on the mosquito surveillance data, disease test results and weather conditions provided by Dragon Mosquito Control. Diseases such as EEE and West Nile Virus are generally found in mosquitoes during the latter part of the summer and early fall. Residents will be advised in advance if spraying is planned. 

FREE FIRESTOP CONCEPTS, CODES & SYSTEMS TRAINING APR 27 FOR CONTRACTORS, DEVELOPERS, INSPECTORS, RESIDENTS -- The session takes place in City Hall Council Chambers and via Zoom from 9 am to 12 noon (check-in starts at 8 am). Advanced registration is required. This training is presented by Wayne Barrow, a firestop contractor for 16 years and the founder and president of VeriCon. Barrow is author of three books on firestop inspection and quality control and has trained more than 8000 building officials, architects, contractors and facilities personnel.



REMINDER DOG LICENSE DEADLINE IS

APRIL 30 – New or annual renewals: \$10 per male or female dog. \$7.50 per neutered or spayed dog. \$3 per dog owned by a Senior Citizen (age 65 or older; first dog only). \$7.50 per each puppy aged 3 to 7 months for first-time licensing. COMMUNITY RISK – CDC recommends using its online tool -- COVID-19 Community Levels -- to help decide what prevention steps to take based on the latest data. Levels can be low, medium, or high and are determined by looking at hospital beds being used, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area. The City Manager encourages the use of masks indoors in City facilities. Please note that masks are still required in the Portsmouth Public Library.

CDC UPDATE ON OPTIONAL SECOND BOOSTER -- On March 30, 2022 The CDC updated their <u>Interim Clinical Considerations</u> <u>for Use of COVID-19 Vaccines</u> to allow for a 2nd booster dose in certain persons:

- Persons 12 years of age or older who are moderately or severely immunocompromised may choose to receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their 1st booster
- All persons 50 years of age or older (regardless of immunocompromised status) may choose to receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their 1st booster
- Persons 18-49 years of age (regardless of immunocompromised status) who received the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine for both their primary series and 1st booster may receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their Janssen booster

FEDERAL INCOME TAX FILING DEADLINE:

APR 18, 2022 -- The due date is April 18, instead of April 15, because of the Emancipation Day holiday in the District of Columbia for everyone except taxpayers who live in Maine or Massachusetts who have until April 19, 2022, to file their returns due to the Patriots' Day holiday in those states. HIGHER ASSET LIMITS SET TO QUALIFY FOR ELDERLY AND DISABLED TAX

REDUCTIONS – The City Council has raised the Elderly Tax asset limit to \$500,000 (from \$175,000) and the Disabled Tax asset limit, also to \$500,000. The Council also approved extending the Disabled Veteran/Disabled Officer exemption to \$4,000 and added flexibility on the April 15 deadline so taxpayers have time to make arrangements with the City Clerk. RUTH LEWIN GRIFFIN PLACE AFFORDABLE HOUSING APPLICATION SITE NOW OPEN!

The Portsmouth Housing Authority development, now under construction, features 48 one-bedroom apartments and 16 two-bedroom units. The units will be available to people who meet income requirements. EMERGENCY RENTAL & UTILITIES

ASSISTANCE – The NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program (NHERAP) provides funds to renters who cannot pay their rent and utilities during the pandemic. The program works with tenants and landlords. Program changes as of October 1, 2021:

- Households may qualify for assistance for past-due and future rent and utility payments for a period <u>not</u> to exceed 18 months.
- At least one person in the household must have qualified for unemployment benefits, had their income reduced, had significant costs, or had other financial hardship <u>during</u> the pandemic. Certain income requirements must be met.

WHAT THE PROGRAM COVERS

- Past-due rent including reasonable late and legal fees.
- Three months of future rent payments if needed for housing stability.
- Utilities, such as electricity, home heating costs, water, sewer, trash.

- Other housing-related costs such as internet and relocation expenses (including rental application fees, utility hook-up fees, and security deposits).
- Households may qualify for utility assistance even if they do not receive or need rental assistance.
