
- History of Portsmouth's Drinking Water System

REMINDER DOG LICENSE DEADLINE IS

APRIL 30 – New or annual renewals: \$10 per male or female dog. \$7.50 per neutered or spayed dog. \$3 per dog owned by a Senior Citizen (age 65 or older; first dog only). \$7.50 per each puppy aged 3 to 7 months for first-time licensing. Proof of spay/neuter will be required for the next April 1st licensing. Licenses available from the City Clerk's Office in City Hall. 1 Junkins Ave. Portsmouth. (603) 610-7245. Monday 8am to 6pm. HYDRANT FLUSHING STARTED APR 11 -- The

flushing will take place at various locations, Monday through Thursday, between 7 am and 11 pm, for the next six weeks. The flushing program is critical for maintaining water quality throughout the distribution system by removing sediment buildup in both public and private hydrants in Portsmouth, New Castle, Rye, Greenland and Newington. Crews open select fire hydrants, releasing water with enough velocity to carry sediment out of the pipes. Flushing locations are indicated by the presence of DPW Water Division vehicles with flashing lights.

MAY -- The work includes reconstruction of the paved area, handicapped accessibility upgrades, subsurface preparations that would allow for EV charging stations and landscaping.

CDC GUIDANCE ON ASSESSING
COMMUNITY RISK – CDC recommends using its online tool -- COVID-19 Community
Levels based on hospital beds being used, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area. The City Manager encourages

the use of masks indoors in City facilities.
Please note that masks are still required in the Portsmouth Public Library.

CDC UPDATE ON OPTIONAL SECOND BOOSTER -- On March 30, 2022 The CDC updated their <u>Interim Clinical Considerations</u> <u>for Use of COVID-19 Vaccines</u> to allow for a 2nd booster dose in certain persons:

- Persons 12 years of age or older who are moderately or severely immunocompromised may choose to receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their 1st booster
- All persons 50 years of age or older (regardless of immunocompromised status) may choose to receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their 1st booster. Second booster is recommended for those age 60+
- Persons 18-49 years of age (regardless of immunocompromised status) who received the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine for both their primary series and 1st booster may receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their Janssen booster



PEIRCE ISLAND ROAD WORK FOR SEWER FORCE MAINS PROJECT -- Work continues on the project to replace the force mains to the Peirce Island Wastewater Treatment Facility.

EMERGENCY RENTAL & UTILITIES

ASSISTANCE — The NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program (NHERAP) provides funds to renters who cannot pay their rent and utilities during the pandemic. The program works with tenants and landlords. Program changes as of October 1, 2021:

- Households may qualify for assistance for past-due and future rent and utility payments for a period <u>not</u> to exceed 18 months.
- At least one person in the household must have qualified for unemployment benefits, had their income reduced, had significant costs, or had other financial hardship <u>during</u> the pandemic. Certain income requirements must be met.

WHAT THE PROGRAM COVERS

- Past-due rent including reasonable late and legal fees
- Three months of future rent payments if needed for housing stability.
- Utilities, such as electricity, home heating costs, water, sewer, trash.
- Other housing-related costs such as internet and relocation expenses (including rental application fees, utility hook-up fees, and security deposits).
- Households may qualify for utility assistance even if they do not receive or need rental assistance.
