COAST BUS SERVICE CHANGE EFFECTIVE SAT MAY 21 --Due to an acute shortage of CDL-qualified operators, COAST regrettably has announced that they must suspend Saturday service on all fixed routes, ADA paratransit, and other demand response services, and must reduce the weekday frequency of service on Routes 40/43 (Portsmouth/Newington) and Routes 1/33 (Dover/Somersworth/Berwick). Saturday Route 7 On Demand service will shift to Tuesdays for the time being. 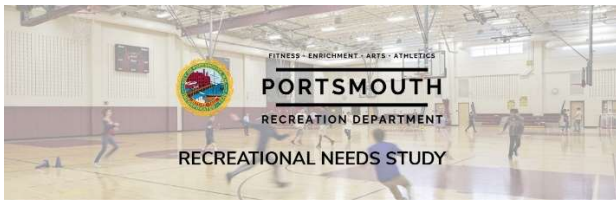

DANIEL STREET NOW OPEN TO SINGLE LANE OF TRAFFIC. BUSINESSES AND PEDESTRIAN ACCESS REMAIN OPEN –

Sidewalk work in connection with the [60 Penhallow Brick Market project](#) will continue to limit traffic. Businesses and pedestrian access will be open throughout construction.

BRIDGE STREET LOT – SCHEDULED TO OPEN END OF NEXT WEEK.

The work includes reconstruction of the paved area, handicapped accessibility upgrades, subsurface preparations that would allow for EV charging stations and landscaping.

STARTING TODAY MAY 9: MARCY STREET BETWEEN SOUTH ST. AND NEW CASTLE AVE. PREP WORK– One-way, alternating traffic for road work and repaving on Pleasant Street between South St. and New Castle Ave., prep work May 9. Mechanized work starts Mon May 16, as crews begin removing the existing pavement and roadbed of Marcy St from New Castle Avenue to South St. Once Marcy Street's roadbed is replaced, crews will start working on the portion of New Castle Avenue from South St to Marcy St. as this area of New Castle Avenue is getting the pavement and roadbed replaced as well. Detours will be in place during working hours (7am-7pm) as some portions of the roads are insufficiently wide to maintain through traffic. To follow this project, subscribe to this email list.

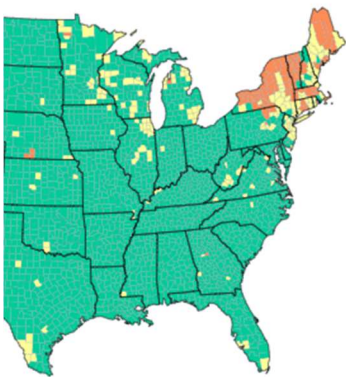

FDA LIMITS USE OF J&J VACCINE -- Due to the ongoing risk of rare but serious blood clots. The problem occurs in the first two weeks after vaccination. Under the new FDA instructions, J&J's vaccine could still be given to people who had a severe allergic reaction to one of the other vaccines and can't receive an additional dose. J&J's shot could also be an option for people who refuse to receive the mRNA vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna, and therefore would otherwise remain unvaccinated.



CDC GUIDANCE ON ASSESSING COMMUNITY RISK – CDC recommends using its online tool -- [COVID-19 Community Levels](#) based on hospital beds being used, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area. **The City Manager encourages the use of masks indoors in City facilities. Please note that masks are still required in the Portsmouth Public Library.**

CDC GUIDANCE ON OPTIONAL SECOND BOOSTER -- On March 30, 2022 The CDC updated their [Interim Clinical Considerations for Use of COVID-19 Vaccines](#) to allow for a 2nd booster dose in certain persons:

- Persons 12 years of age or older who are moderately or severely immunocompromised may choose to receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their 1st booster
- All persons 50 years of age or older (regardless of immunocompromised status) may choose to receive a 2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their 1st booster. **Second booster is recommended for those age 60+**
- Persons 18-49 years of age (regardless of immunocompromised status) who received the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine for both their primary series and 1st booster may receive a

2nd mRNA booster at least 4 months after their Janssen booster

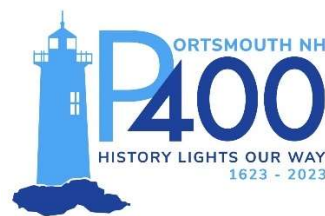

EMERGENCY RENTAL & UTILITIES

ASSISTANCE – The [NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program](#) (NHERAP) provides funds to renters who cannot pay their rent and utilities during the pandemic. The program works with tenants and landlords. Program changes as of October 1, 2021:

- Households may qualify for assistance for past-due and future rent and utility payments for a period not to exceed 18 months.
- At least one person in the household must have qualified for unemployment benefits, had their income reduced, had significant costs, or had other financial hardship during the pandemic. Certain income requirements must be met.

WHAT THE PROGRAM COVERS

- Past-due rent including reasonable late and legal fees.
- Three months of future rent payments if needed for housing stability.
- Utilities, such as electricity, home heating costs, water, sewer, trash.
- Other housing-related costs such as internet and relocation expenses (including rental application fees, utility hook-up fees, and security deposits).
- Households may qualify for utility assistance even if they do not receive or need rental assistance.
