



What is ARPA?

The federal government's
American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)
provides funding for state and
local governments.

The Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide substantial flexibility for each jurisdiction to meet local needs—including support for households, small businesses, impacted industries, essential workers, and the communities hardest-hit by the crisis.




How Much Did the City of Portsmouth Receive?

The City of Portsmouth received \$12,880,280

April 4, 2022 Presentation to the
Public on ARPA funds

April 18, 2022 - Public Hearing to appropriate \$5,325,000 to five (5) projects

June 6, 2022 - The FY23 Adopted Budget appropriated \$1,687,600 for eight (8) projects

May 21, 2021 - First half of ARPA funds received June 14, 2021 - City holds its first ARPA work session to discuss funding and uses

April 11, 2022 -Public Listening Session May 22, 2022 -Second half of ARPA funds received September 12, 2022 -City Council ARPA Work Session




