DANIEL STREET LANE CLOSURE MON NOV 7 & TUES NOV 8

-- Severino Construction will be completing the 60 Penhallow conduit installation reducing Daniel Street to one lane. Police details will be in place to ensure traffic flow. On-street parking will be limited in the Penhallow-Daniel intersection area. Eversource will also be working on Daniel St on Mon Nov 7, installing a new utility pole in the alley east of Moe's Sandwich shop. It is their intent to complete the work in one day. Eversource will be using a vacuum truck to assist in clearing the pathway for the pole installation. The work is expected to be noisy and the duration will be dependent on the obstructions found while installing the pole.

STATE STREET SIDEWALKS PROJECT WORK CONTINUES --Those who park on the street should move their cars by 7 am or risk being towed. NHDOT UPDATES 511 TRAVELER INFORMATION SYSTEM -- The NHDOT has updated the [New England 511 Traveler Information System website](#) which helps motorists navigate through Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont by providing real-time road and weather conditions, links to live cameras, notes on future events and more. The My Trips feature, now called **My 511**, has also been updated. This application sends notifications to users, via email or text messages based on user created routes, to alert them to construction or crashes that may impact a daily commute or any trip within Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont. Because of the extensive changes to the program, commuters that have used My Trips in the past will have to create a new account in the system.

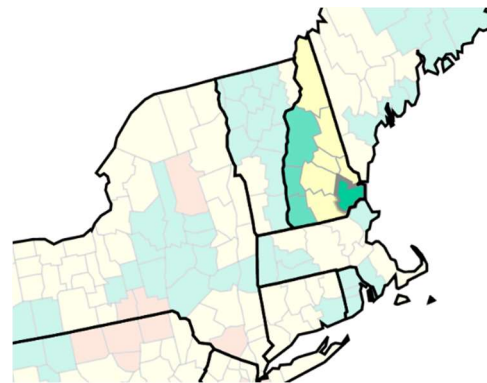

advises that everyone over 12 who completed the primary series vaccination 3 months ago or more should receive the new bivalent boosters. By receiving the booster (and this year's flu vaccine) you may help blunt the expected winter surge and demand on healthcare providers. The boosters are based on clinical research with the BA.1 bivalent vaccine, conducted in humans and were found to provide increased protection against severe disease and broader protection against existing and anticipated variants.

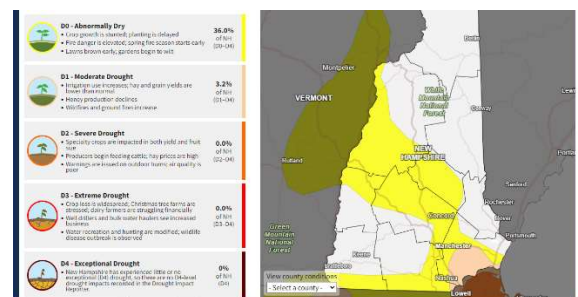

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION DAY SAT NOV 12, 8 AM-12 NOON -- At the Public Works facility at 680 Peverly Hill Road. Residents of Portsmouth, Greenland and Newington are encouraged to bring household chemicals for safe disposal between 8 am and 12 noon. Proof of residency is required. Household hazardous waste collection helps safely dispose of items that can harm residents' health, the environment and drinking water supplies. CURBSIDE YARD WASTE/LEAVES PICKUP
Bagged leaves and other yard waste are collected by DPW through Nov 30 on the same day as your normal Solid Waste/trash.

PLEASE NOTE: Use only paper or plastic biodegradable bags. If you opt to use the plastic biodegradable bags, the bags must be factory-labeled "biodegradable." Yard waste bags, when placed curbside, shall not weigh more than 50 pounds each. **PLEASE DO NOT dispose of leaves or clippings in or near storm drains, drainage channels (where water drains rain or melting snow), wetlands or water bodies!** Check out what “Blue” has to say about yard waste: <https://tinyurl.com/25rww8r>

STATE AID CREDIT ON ELECTRIC BILLS -- The NH Legislature has approved allocating \$35 million to NH residents earning from 60% to 75% of the state's median income (\$75,000 to \$93,000 per year for a family of four). Those who are eligible and apply will get \$200 credits on their electric bills and \$450 for heating assistance. Residents with incomes below that threshold already are also eligible for other funds. You must apply through one of these Community Action Program agency to receive the assistance. **Rockingham County**

ENERGY EFFICIENCY TIPS AND PAYMENT HELP – On **Aug 1**, New Hampshire electric supply rates increased to more than double last August’s supply rate. This significant rate increase is due to record-high natural gas prices and the global economy. EMERGENCY RENTAL & UTILITIES ASSISTANCE

– The [NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program](#) (NHERAP) provides funds to renters who cannot pay their rent and utilities during the pandemic. The program works with tenants and landlords. Program changes as of October 1, 2021:

- Households may qualify for assistance for past-due and future rent and utility payments for a period not to exceed 18 months.
- At least one person in the household must have qualified for unemployment benefits, had their income reduced, had significant costs, or had other financial hardship during the pandemic. Certain income requirements must be met.

WHAT THE PROGRAM COVERS

- Past-due rent including reasonable late and legal fees.
- Three months of future rent payments if needed for housing stability.
- Utilities, such as electricity, home heating costs, water, sewer, trash.
- Other housing-related costs such as internet and relocation expenses (including rental application fees, utility hook-up fees, and security deposits).
- Households may qualify for utility assistance even if they do not receive or need rental assistance.
