- Spinnaker open as usual til 8pm.





400 TREES FOR THE 400<sup>TH</sup>! -- The City is celebrating the 400th anniversary by planting 400 trees: 100 are the usual Tree City annual plantings, 100 trees are being donated by Portsmouth Rotary to celebrate its 100th anniversary in 2023 and 200 more are designated for local residents to plant at their homes or businesses. 
