Whereas: In New Hampshire, the medical centers addressing MS directly

include Wentworth-Douglass Hospital, Dartmouth-Hitchcock, Concord Hospital, the MS Clinic of NH in Lebanon and the Manchester VA are striving to understand the cause and course of MS and, with efforts to raise awareness and funding through the National MS Society, to create a world free of MS by heightening

public knowledge about and insight into the disease; and

Whereas: Since 1946 the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has been a

driving force of MS research, relentlessly pursuing prevention, treatments and a cure, and has invested more than \$1 billion in groundbreaking research, thereby transforming what it means to live with MS and providing global leadership to help achieve the

vision of a world free of MS; and

Whereas: Here in Portsmouth and on the Seacoast we recognize the

importance of finding the cause and cure of MS and express our appreciation for the dedication that the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has shown toward giving those affected more control over

their lives and creating a world free of MS.
